

Conflict of Interest Code for the California Enterprise Development Authority

The Political Reform Act (Government Code Section 81000, et seq.) requires state and local government agencies to adopt and promulgate conflict of interest codes. The Fair Political Practices Commission has adopted a regulation (2 California Code of Regulations Section 18730) that contains the terms of a standard conflict of interest code, which can be incorporated by reference in an agency's code. After public notice and hearing, the standard code may be amended by the Fair Political Practices Commission to conform to amendments in the Political Reform Act. Therefore, the terms of 2 California Code of Regulations Section 18730 and any amendments to it duly adopted by the Fair Political Practices Commission are hereby incorporated by reference. This regulation and the attached Appendices, designating positions and establishing disclosure categories, shall constitute the conflict of interest code of the **CA Enterprise Development Authority (CEDA)**.

Individuals holding positions listed in this code must file their statements of economic interests electronically with the **Fair Political Practices Commission**. All statements must be made available for public inspection and reproduction under Government Code Section 81008.

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APPENDIX A
DESIGNATED POSITIONS

List of Designated Positions:	Disclosure Categories
Board Members and Alternates	1, 2, 3
Consultants & New Positions	*

*Consultants/new positions shall be included in the list of designated positions and shall disclose pursuant to the broadest disclosure category in the code subject to the following limitation:

The Chair of the Board may determine in writing that a particular consultant or new position, although a “designated position,” is hired to perform a range of duties that is limited in scope and thus is not required to comply fully with the disclosure requirements described in this section. Such written determination shall include a description of the consultant’s or new position’s duties and, based upon that description, a statement of the extent of disclosure requirements. The Chair of the Board’s determination is a public record and shall be retained for public inspection in the same manner and location as this conflict-of-interest code (Gov. Code Sec. 81008).

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APPENDIX B
DISCLOSURE CATEGORIES

Category 1

Real property located within the jurisdiction, as well as real property within two miles of the real property owned or used by the agency or the potential site.

Category 2

Investments and business positions in business entities and sources of income (including receipt of gifts, loans and travel payments) if the business entity or source is of the type to receive bonds or other funding from or through CEDA.

Category 3

Investments and business positions in business entities and sources of income (including receipt of gifts, loans, and travel payments) if the business entity or source provides leased facilities, products, equipment, vehicles, machinery or services(including training or consulting services) of the type utilized by CEDA.
